In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seven.

AN ACT

To provide for Increased Facilities for the Enforcement by the State Board of Health of the Laws relative to Adulterated Food and Drugs.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section six of chapter seventy-five of the
2 Revised Laws, as amended by chapter four hundred and
3 sixty-seven of the acts of nineteen hundred and three is
4 hereby amended by striking out, in the second line, the
5 word "twelve," and substituting therefor the word:—
6 fourteen,—so that the same shall read:—*Section 6.*
7 The state board of health may annually expend not more
8 than fourteen thousand five hundred dollars for the en-
9 forcement of the provisions of sections sixteen to twenty-
10 seven, inclusive; but not less than three-fifths of said
11 amount shall be annually expended for the enforcement
12 of the laws against the adulteration of milk and milk
13 products.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
