AN ACT

Relative to the Arrest of Non-Residents for Violation of
Statutes regulating the Control of Automobiles.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the
same, as follows:*

1 Any person not having in his possession a license to
2 operate an automobile granted by the Massachusetts
3 highway commission who violates any statute, by-law or
4 ordinance relating to the operation or control of auto-
5 mobiles may be arrested without a warrant by an officer
6 authorized to make arrests and kept in custody not more
7 than twenty-four hours, Sunday excepted; at or before
8 the expiration of which time he shall be brought before
9 a proper magistrate and proceeded against according to
10 law.
