Bill accompanying the petition of Ezra H. Baker and others, licensing board for the city of Boston, for legislation to establish the salary of the secretary of said board. Public Service. January 8.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Eight.

AN ACT

To establish the Salary of the Secretary of the Licensing Board for the City of Boston.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section two of chapter two hundred and ninety-
2 one of the acts of nineteen hundred and six is
3 hereby amended, in the second line, by inserting the
4 word:— and,— after the word “dollars,” and in the
5 third and fourth lines, by striking out the words “and
6 that of the secretary twenty-five hundred dollars,” and
7 inserting in place thereof the words:— The annual sal-
8 ary of the secretary shall not exceed thirty-five hundred
9 dollars,— so as to read:—

10 *Section 2.* The annual salary of the chairman of
11 said board shall be four thousand dollars, and that of
12 each of the other two members thirty-five hundred dol-
13 lars. The annual salary of the secretary shall not ex-
14 ceed thirty-five hundred dollars. Such salaries shall be
15 paid in monthly instalments by the city of Boston. Sub-
16 ject to the approval of the governor and council, said
17 board shall be provided with such rooms, in the head-
18 quarters of the police commissioner hereinafter named,
19 as shall be convenient and suitable for the performance
20 of its duties, the rent of which shall be paid by the city
21 of Boston. Said rooms shall be suitably furnished and
22 equipped, and the expense therefor shall be paid by said
23 city upon requisition of said board.
