AN ACT

Relative to the Amount of Money that may be deposited in Savings Banks by Labor Unions.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 2 hundred and thirteen of the Revised Laws is hereby
- 3 amended by inserting after the word "corpora-
- 4 tions," in line eight, the words: or by labor
- 5 unions, so as to read as follows: Section 25.
- 6 Such corporation may receive deposits from any

- 8 and may allow interest upon such deposits, and upon

10 with the accrued interest, amounts to one thousand
