AN ACT

To facilitate the Inspection of Wires in Buildings in the
City of Boston.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the
same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Section one of chapter two hundred and
2 sixty-eight of the acts of eighteen hundred and ninety-
3 eight is hereby amended by adding to said section the
4 following: — Any person, firm or corporation failing to
5 notify the commissioner of wires of the installing of wir-
6 ing or apparatus for electric light, heat or power purposes
7 as hereinbefore provided shall be subject to a fine of not
8 less than ten nor more than fifty dollars for each offence.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
