AN ACT

To define the Duties of the Female Members of the Inspection Department of the District Police.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The duties of the two female members
2 of the inspection department of the district police shall
3 be as follows, except in so far as said duties are other-
4 wise provided for by law:— One of the said members
5 shall be detailed by the chief of the said police to see that
6 the laws relating to women and minors employed in
7 workshops and textile factories in all parts of the Com-
8 monwealth are observed and enforced, and shall also be
9 charged with the duty of seeing that the specifications
10 law, so called, is enforced so far as it applies to work-
11 shops and textile factories. The other female member
12 of the district police shall be detailed by the chief of
13 the said police to see that the laws relating to women
14 and minors are observed in mercantile establishments and
15 workshops throughout the Commonwealth. The head-

16 quarters of the said female inspectors shall be in the
17 city of Boston.

1 SECTION 2. So much of chapter three hundred and
2 eighty-two of the acts of the year nineteen hundred and
3 four as is inconsistent herewith is hereby repealed.

1 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
