AN ACT

To incorporate the Lowell Funeral Association.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Maxine Lepine, Amedee Archambault,
2 Augusts Levesque, George E. Caisse, George E. Mangeau,
3 Napoleon Bilodeau, their associates and successors, are
4 hereby made a corporation by the name of the Lowell
5 Funeral Association, to be located in the city of Lowell,
6 for the purpose and with the powers of providing, through
7 assessments upon its members, the funds necessary for
8 defraying the burial expenses of deceased members and
9 of their deceased dependent children; the membership to
10 be limited to French people and their descendants who
11 are or have been residents of the city of Lowell in this
12 Commonwealth.

13 The said corporation shall, except as herein otherwise
14 provided, have and may exercise all the powers, rights
15 and privileges, and shall be subject to all the duties, lia-
16 bilities and requirements under the law applicable to
17 fraternal beneficiary corporations according to section
18 twelve, chapter one hundred and nineteen of the Revised
19 Laws.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
