AN ACT

To authorize the City of Fall River to incur Indebtedness for Sewer Purposes.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. For the purpose of constructing
2 sewers and for other sewer purposes the city of
3 Fall River, in addition to authority previously
4 granted to the city to incur debts outside of its
5 statutory debt limit, is hereby authorized to incur
6 indebtedness outside of the statutory debt limit
7 of the city to an amount not exceeding fifty thou-
8 sand dollars, and to issue notes, bonds or scrip
9 therefor in such denominations as it may deter-
10 mine, payable within thirty years from the dates
11 of issue and bearing interest at a rate not exceed-
12 ing four per cent per annum, payable semi-an-
13 nually.

1 SECTION 2. The city at the time of authorizing
2 said loan shall provide for the payment thereof in
3 accordance with the provisions of section thirteen

4 of chapter twenty-seven of the Revised Laws, and
5 of acts in amendment thereof, as the city council
6 may determine.

1 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
