Bill accompanying ninth recommendation of the Chief of the District Police (Pub. Doc. No. 32). Labor. January 9.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Eleven.

AN ACT

Relative to the Employment of Minors in Factories, Workshops and Mercantile Establishments.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. No minor sixteen years of age or over
2 shall be employed in a factory, workshop or mercantile
3 establishment unless his employer procures and keeps on
4 file, accessible to the truant officers of the city or town,
5 and to the district police and inspectors of factories and
6 public buildings, a certificate showing that such minor
7 is sixteen years of age or over; said certificate shall give
8 the place and date of birth of such minor, and his per-
9 sonal description. The printed form of such certificate
10 shall be provided by the chief of the district police, and
11 shall be approved by the attorney-general.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
