Bill accompanying the petition of Andrew P. Doyle for legislation to provide that the number of licenses granted in cities and towns for the sale of intoxicating liquors may be unlimited in number. The Liquor Law. January 12.

AN ACT

To provide that Licenses for the Sale of Intoxicating Liquors may be Unlimited in Number.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. At the annual election of the cities and
2 towns of the commonwealth, the city of Boston excepted,
3 there shall be placed upon the official ballot to be voted
4 upon, the following question: — Shall licenses for the sale
5 of intoxicating liquors be unlimited in number?

1 SECTION 2. In cities or towns which vote to issue
2 licenses for the sale of intoxicating liquors, when the
3 aforesaid question is answered in the affirmative by a
4 majority of the voters voting thereon in such city or town,
5 the number of licenses to sell intoxicating liquors in such

6 city or town shall not be limited in accordance with the
7 provisions of chapter one hundred, section thirteen of the
8 Revised Laws and acts in amendment thereof.

1 SECTION 3. All acts inconsistent herewith are hereby
2 repealed.

1 SECTION 4. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
