## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Eleven.

### AN ACT

To prohibit the delivery of Intoxicating Liquors in Certain Instances except for Monetary Consideration.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The fourth clause of section seventeen  
2 of chapter one hundred of the Revised Laws is hereby  
3 amended by adding at the end thereof, at the thirty-  
4 fourth line of said section, the words: — nor shall any  
5 liquor be delivered to any person on the licensed premises  
6 by the licensee or any person in his behalf except for a fair  
7 monetary consideration, — so that the said clause shall  
8 read: — Fourth, That liquor shall not be sold or deliv-  
9 ered on the licensed premises to a person who is known  
10 to be a drunkard, to an intoxicated person, or to a person  
11 who is known to have been intoxicated within the six  
12 months last preceding, or to a minor, either for his own

13 use, the use of his parents or of any other person, or,  
14 unless upon the prescription of a duly registered physician,  
15 to a person known to have been supported in whole or in  
16 part by public charity at any time during the twelve  
17 months last preceding the date of the license; nor shall  
18 any liquor be delivered to any person on the licensed  
19 premises by the licensee or any other person in his be-  
20 half except for a fair monetary consideration.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
