Bill accompanying the petition of Harry Francis Woodward for legislation relative to the assignment of wages. Legal Affairs. January 18.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Eleven.

AN ACT

Relative to the Assignment of Wages.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. No assignment of or order for wages to
2 be earned in the future shall be valid against an em-
3 ployer of the person making the assignment or order
4 until the assignment or order is accepted in writing by
5 the employer, and the assignment or order and the ac-
6 ceptance of the same has been filed or recorded with the
7 clerk of the city or town where the person making the
8 assignment or order resides, if he is a resident of the
9 commonwealth, or in which he is employed, if not a res-
10 ident of the commonwealth.

1 SECTION 2. No such assignment or order shall be
2 valid when made by a married man unless the written
3 consent of his wife to the making of such assignment or
4 order is attached thereto.

1 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect on the first
2 day of September in the year nineteen hundred and
3 eleven.
