AN ACT

Making Appropriations for Salaries and Expenses in
the Department of the Sergeant-at-Arms.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the
same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The sums hereinafter mentioned are
2 appropriated to be paid out of the treasury of the
3 commonwealth from the ordinary revenue for the
4 salaries and expenses in the department of the
5 sergeant-at-arms, for the fiscal year ending on the
6 thirtieth day of November, nineteen hundred and
7 eleven, to wit:—

8 For the salary of the sergeant-at-arms, thirty-five
9 hundred dollars. (Rev. Laws, ch. 10, sect. 10; Acts
10 1903, ch. 455.)

(Appropriation 1910, \$3,500.)

11 For the salary of the first clerk, twenty-two
12 hundred dollars. (Rev. Laws, ch. 10, sect. 10; Acts
13 1903, ch. 455.)

(Appropriation 1910, \$2,200.)

14 For the salary of the cashier, a sum not exceeding
15 one thousand dollars. (Rev. Laws, ch. 10; Acts
16 1903, ch. 323.)

(Appropriation 1910, \$1,000.)

17 For the salaries of additional clerks, the sum
18 of twenty-eight hundred dollars. (Acts 1909, ch.
19 174.)

(Appropriation 1910, \$2,800.)

20 For incidental and contingent expenses and ex-
21 pense of mailing legislative bulletins, a sum not
22 exceeding four hundred and fifty dollars. (Rev.
23 Laws, ch. 10.)

(Appropriation 1910, \$450.)

24 For the salaries of the chief engineer and other
25 employees in the engineer's department, a sum not
26 exceeding thirty thousand nine hundred and forty
27 dollars. (Rev. Laws, ch. 10, sect. 9; Acts 1906, ch.
28 232; 1910, ch. 634.)

(Appropriation 1910, \$29,673.36, part of a year.)

29 For the salaries of the watchmen and assistant
30 watchmen, a sum not exceeding fourteen thousand
31 and six hundred dollars. (Rev. Laws, ch. 10, sect.
32 9; Acts 1903, ch. 455.)

(Appropriation 1910, \$14,600.)

33 For books, stationery, postage, printing and ad-
34 vertising, ordered by the sergeant-at-arms, a sum
35 not exceeding twelve hundred dollars. (Rev. Laws,
36 ch. 6, sect. 49.)

(Appropriation 1910, \$1,200.)

37 For the salaries of the messengers, porters and
38 office boy, a sum not exceeding eighty-two hundred
39 and sixty dollars. (Rev. Laws, ch. 10; Acts 1907,
40 chs. 359 and 384.)

(Appropriation 1910, \$8,260.)

41 For rent of telephones and expenses in connection
42 therewith, a sum not exceeding eighty-two hundred
43 dollars. (Rev. Laws, ch. 10.)

(Appropriation 1910, \$8,000.)

44 For heat, light and power, including coal, water,
45 gas and removal of ashes, a sum not exceeding
46 thirty-five thousand dollars. (Rev. Laws, ch. 10.)
(Appropriation 1910, \$35,000.)

47 For the care of the state house and grounds, in-
48 cluding repairs, furniture and repairs thereof, and
49 such expenses as may be necessary at the various
50 buildings now occupied by state departments, a sum
51 not exceeding twenty-six thousand dollars. (Rev.
52 Laws, ch. 10.)

(Appropriation 1910, \$32,000.)

53 For new furniture and fixtures, a sum not exceed-
54 ing six thousand dollars. (Rev. Laws, ch. 10.)

(Appropriation 1910, \$6,000.)

55 For the salary of the matron, a sum not exceed-
56 ing eight hundred and fifty dollars. (Rev Laws,
57 ch. 10; Acts 1910, ch. 152.)

(Appropriation 1910, \$850.)

58 For the salary of the carpenter, the sum of four-
59 teen hundred dollars. (Rev. Laws, ch. 10.)

(Appropriation 1910, \$1,400.)

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its pas-
2 sage.
