AN ACT

Making Appropriations for Salaries and Expenses in the Department of the Auditor of the Commonwealth.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The sums hereinafter mentioned are
2 appropriated to be paid out of the treasury of the
3 commonwealth, from the ordinary revenue, for the
4 auditor's department, for the fiscal year ending on
5 the thirtieth day of November, nineteen hundred
6 and eleven, to wit:—

7 For the salary of the auditor, five thousand dol-
8 lars. (Rev. Laws, ch. 6, sect. 14; Acts 1907, ch. 276.)
(Appropriation 1910, \$5,000.)

9 For the salary of the deputy auditor, thirty-five
10 hundred dollars. (Acts 1908, ch. 597.)
(Appropriation 1910, \$3,500.)

11 For the salary of the supervisor of accounts,
12 twenty-five hundred dollars. (Acts 1908, ch. 597.)
(Appropriation 1910, \$2,500.)

13 For the salary of the first clerk, twenty-five hun-

14 dred dollars. (Rev. Laws, ch. 6, sect. 14; Acts 1907,
15 ch. 139.)

(Appropriation 1910, \$2,500.)

16 For the salary of the second clerk, twenty-two
17 hundred dollars. (Rev. Laws, ch. 6, sect. 14; Acts
18 1907, ch. 139.)

(Appropriation 1910, \$2,200.)

19 For additional clerks, examiners and stenograph-
20 ers, a sum not exceeding fourteen thousand dollars.
21 (Acts 1907, ch. 139.)

(Appropriation 1910, \$14,000.)

22 For the salary of the messenger, nine hundred
23 dollars. (Rev. Laws, ch. 6, sect. 14; Acts 1907, ch.
24 139.)

(Appropriation 1910, \$900.)

25 For the salary of the state printing expert, a sum
26 not exceeding fifteen hundred dollars. (Rev. Laws,
27 ch. 6, sect. 18.)

(Appropriation 1910, \$1,500.)

28 For incidental and contingent expenses, a sum not
29 exceeding twenty-five hundred dollars. (Rev. Laws,
30 ch. 6, sect. 25.)

(Appropriation 1910, \$2,500.)

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its pas-
2 sage.
