AN ACT

In Addition to the Acts making Appropriations for Sundry Miscellaneous Expenses authorized during the Present Year and for Sundry Miscellaneous Expenses authorized by Law.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The sums hereinafter mentioned are ap-
2 propriated to be paid out of the treasury of the common-
3 wealth, from the ordinary revenue, except as hereinafter
4 otherwise provided, for the purposes specified, to wit:

5 For expenses in connection with the segregation and
6 treatment of persons afflicted with epilepsy and other
7 nervous diseases, as authorized by chapter twenty-four of
8 the resolves of the present year, a sum not exceeding three
9 hundred dollars.

10 For expenses of a commission to consider in what man-
11 ner the commonwealth may best co-operate with other
12 states and with the federal government in the develop-
13 ment of inland water ways, as authorized by chapter
14 twenty-six of the resolves of the present year, a sum not
15 exceeding five hundred dollars.

16 For the estate of Lendell P. Cazeau, as authorized by
17 chapter twenty-seven of the resolves of the present year,
18 the sum of twenty-eight hundred seventeen dollars and
19 thirty-one cents.

20 For William J. Batt, as authorized by chapter thirty-
21 seven of the resolves of the present year, the sum of two
22 hundred and fifty dollars.

23 For expenses of an investigation relative to the con-
24 struction of a teaming tunnel under Boston harbor to
25 East Boston, as authorized by chapter thirty-eight of the
26 resolves of the present year, a sum not exceeding five hun-
27 dred dollars.

28 For Arthur F. Butterworth, as authorized by chapter
29 thirty-nine of the resolves of the present year, the sum of
30 twenty-five dollars, to be paid out of the Motor Vehicle
31 Fees Fund.

32 For the Massachusetts Charitable Eye and Ear In-
33 firmary, as authorized by chapter forty of the resolves of
34 the present year, the sum of forty-five thousand dollars.

35 To provide for the preservation of an ancient monument
36 or boundary mark between the towns of North Attle-
37 borough and Plainville, as authorized by chapter forty-
38 two of the resolves of the present year, a sum not exceed-
39 ing five hundred dollars.

40 To provide for the payment of expenses incident to
41 maneuvers of the militia in nineteen hundred and eleven,
42 there may be expended out of the appropriation for com-
43 pensation and transportation of officers and men of the
44 volunteer militia, a sum not exceeding fifteen thousand
45 dollars. (Res. 1911, ch. 46.)

46 For medical examiners' fees, a sum not exceeding seven
47 hundred dollars. (Revised Laws, ch. 24, sec. 29; Acts
48 1905, ch. 211.)

(Appropriation 1910, \$700.)

49 For the payment of damages caused by wild deer for
50 the present and previous years, a sum not exceeding ten
51 thousand dollars. (Acts 1903, ch. 407.)

(Appropriation 1910, \$10,000.)

52 For small items of expenditure for which no appropria-
53 tions have been made or for which appropriations have
54 exhausted or reverted to the commonwealth in previous
55 years, a sum not exceeding one thousand dollars, to be
56 expended under the direction of the auditor of the com-
57 monwealth.

(Appropriation 1910, \$1,000.)

58 For assistance to the town of Truro in maintaining a
59 section of its county highway known as Beach Point road,
60 a sum not exceeding five hundred dollars. Acts 1901,
61 ch. 227.)

(Appropriation 1910, \$500.)

62 To provide further for an investigation by the state
63 board of health of infantile paralysis, as authorized by
64 chapter forty-nine of the resolves of the present year, a
65 sum not exceeding ten thousand dollars.

66 To provide for an extension of the work of the state
67 board of health in regard to the diagnosis of typhoid
68 fever, as authorized by chapter fifty of the resolves of the
69 present year, a sum not exceeding fifteen hundred dollars,
70 this amount to be added to the general appropriation for
71 the state board of health.

72 To provide for the payment of certain bills incurred by
73 a lieutenant of the naval brigade, as authorized by chapter
74 fifty-three of the resolves of the present year, the sum of
75 one hundred twenty-nine dollars and seventy cents.

76 For an investigation and report by the state board of
77 health upon the water supply for the cities of Salem, Bev-
78 erly and the town of Peabody, as authorized by chapter

79 fifty-four of the resolves of the present year, a sum not
80 exceeding fifteen hundred dollars.

81 To provide for an investigation of voluntary associa-
82 tions organized or doing business in the commonwealth
83 under written instruments or declarations of trust, as
84 authorized by chapter fifty-five of the resolves of the pres-
85 ent year, a sum not exceeding twenty-five hundred dollars.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
