AN ACT

Relative to the Appointees of the Board of Education.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter four hundred and fifty-seven of
2 the acts of the year nineteen hundred and nine, as
3 amended by chapter two hundred and eighty-two of the
4 acts of the year nineteen hundred and ten, is hereby
5 amended by striking out section three and inserting in
6 place thereof the following:— *Section 3.* The board
7 shall appoint a commissioner of education whose term of
8 office shall be five years, and may fix his salary at such
9 sum as the governor and council shall approve. Said
10 commissioner may at any time be removed from office
11 by a vote of six members of the board. He shall exercise
12 all the powers and be subject to all the duties now con-
13 ferred or imposed by law on the secretary of the board
14 of education. He shall be the executive officer of the
15 board, shall have supervision of all educational work
16 supported in whole or in part by the commonwealth, and
17 shall report thereon to the board. The board shall also
18 appoint two deputy commissioners, at equal salaries, one

19 of whom shall be especially qualified to deal with indus-
20 trial education. The powers, duties, salaries and terms
21 of office of said deputy commissioners shall be such as
22 may be established from time to time by the board, but
23 the board may, by a vote of six members thereof, remove
24 from office at any time either of said deputy commis-
25 sioners. The board may be allowed for rent, salaries of
26 the commissioner, the deputies, agents, assistance and
27 clerical service and for travelling and other necessary
28 expenses of the commissioner, the deputies, agents and of
29 the board, incurred in the performance of their official
30 duties, such sum as shall be appropriated by the general
31 court annually, payable out of the treasury of the com-
32 monwealth.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
