## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Eleven.

### AN ACT

Making Appropriations for Salaries and Expenses in the  
Bureau of Statistics.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives  
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the  
same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The sums hereinafter mentioned are ap-  
2 propriated, to be paid out of the treasury of the com-  
3 monwealth, from the ordinary revenue, for salaries and  
4 expenses in the bureau of statistics for the fiscal year end-  
5 ing on the thirtieth day of November, nineteen hundred  
6 and eleven, to wit: —

7 For the salary of the director, three thousand dollars.  
8 (Acts 1909, ch. 371.)

(Appropriation 1910, \$3,000.)

9 For the salary of the chief clerk, two thousand dollars.  
10 (Acts 1909, ch. 371.)

(Appropriation 1910, \$2,000.)

11 For additional clerical assistance, a sum not exceeding  
12 forty-three thousand six hundred dollars. (Acts 1909,  
13 ch. 371; 1910, chs. 598, 616 and 624; Res. 1910, ch.  
14 160.)

(Appropriation 1910, \$40,300.)

15 For contingent and office expenses, including printing  
16 and binding the annual reports, and travelling and other  
17 expenses in connection with the annual collection of sta-  
18 tistics of manufactures, also expenses in connection with  
19 municipal returns, a sum not exceeding nineteen thou-  
20 sand one hundred and fifty dollars. (Acts 1909, ch.  
21 371; 1910, chs. 598, 616 and 624; Res. 1910, ch. 160.)

(Appropriation 1910, \$18,370.)

22 For taking a special census in towns having an in-  
23 creased resident population during the summer months, a  
24 sum not exceeding one thousand dollars. (Rev. Laws,  
25 ch. 100, sect. 13.)

(Appropriation 1910, \$1,000.)

26 For the establishment and maintenance of free employ-  
27 ment offices in this commonwealth, a sum not exceeding  
28 twenty-two thousand dollars. (Acts 1906, ch. 435;  
29 1907, ch. 135.)

(Appropriation 1910, \$21,000.)

30 For expenses in connection with the auditing of mu-  
31 nicipal accounts, a sum not exceeding ten thousand dol-  
32 lars. (Acts 1910, ch. 598.)

(No appropriation 1910.)

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
