Bill accompanying fifth recommendation of the Board of Education (House, No. 202). Education. January 8.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Twelve.

AN ACT

Making Appropriations for the Reimbursement of Expenditures for Tuition in Certain Independent Industrial Schools.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The sums hereinafter mentioned are ap-
2 propriated, to be paid out of the treasury of the common-
3 wealth from the ordinary revenue, for meeting the
4 commonwealth's proportion of the cost of tuition in
5 independent industrial schools paid by certain cities
6 and towns, under the authority of section four of chap-
7 ter five hundred and seventy-two of the acts of nineteen
8 hundred and eight, to wit: —

9 For one half of the tuition of pupils attending the
10 Boston evening industrial school during the school year

11 nineteen hundred and ten to nineteen hundred and
12 eleven, due the following towns, to wit:—

13 To the town of Amesbury, the sum of two dollars and
14 ninety-two cents.

15 To the town of Ashland, the sum of four dollars and
16 thirty-eight cents.

17 To the town of Brookline, the sum of seventy-three
18 cents.

19 To the city of Everett, the sum of fifty-four dollars
20 and sixty-nine cents.

21 To the city of Malden, the sum of twenty-six dollars
22 and twenty-two cents.

23 To the city of Medford, the sum of twenty-seven dol-
24 lars and seventy-four cents.

25 To the city of Melrose, the sum of eleven dollars and
26 sixty-five cents.

27 To the city of Somerville, the sum of fifty-nine dol-
28 lars and seventy-four cents.

29 For one half the tuition of pupils attending the Bos-
30 ton trade school for girls during the school years nine-
31 teen hundred and nine to nineteen hundred and ten,
32 also nineteen hundred and ten to nineteen hundred and
33 eleven, due the following towns, to wit:—

102 To the town of Fairhaven, the sum of two hundred
103 seventeen dollars and fifty cents.

104 To the town of Freetown, the sum of seventy-five dol-
105 lars.

106 To the town of Lakeville, the sum of one hundred
107 fifty dollars.

108 To the town of Westport, the sum of one hundred
109 fifty dollars.

110 For one half the tuition of pupils attending the New-
111 ton industrial school during the school year nineteen
112 hundred and ten to nineteen hundred and eleven, due
113 the following towns, to wit:—

114 To the town of Brookline, the sum of forty dollars
115 and fifty cents.

116 To the town of Easton, the sum of fifteen dollars
117 and seventy-five cents.

118 To the town of Watertown, the sum of thirty-nine
119 dollars and thirty-eight cents.

120 For one half the tuition of pupils attending Smith's
121 agricultural school during the school year nineteen hun-
122 dred and ten to nineteen hundred and eleven, due the
123 following towns, to wit:—
