AN ACT

Relative to the Supervision by the Auditor of the Commonwealth of Accounts kept at State Normal Schools.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section ten of chapter thirty-nine of the
2 Revised Laws is hereby amended by striking out, in lines
3 four and five, the words "The accounts of the boarding
4 houses shall be kept under the direction of the auditor of
5 accounts" and inserting in place thereof the words:—
6 The receipts from pupils boarded in halls maintained at
7 normal schools shall be paid into the treasury of the com-
8 monwealth monthly, and so much thereof as is necessary
9 to pay the expenses of wages, food and supplies for dor-
10 mitories and kitchens shall be paid therefrom upon ap-
11 proved schedules accompanied by vouchers in the same
12 manner that other claims against the commonwealth are
13 paid; and all receipts from other sources shall be paid
14 into the treasury of the commonwealth monthly as a part
15 of the general revenue of the commonwealth. The auditor
16 of the commonwealth shall exercise the same direction of

17 all accounts kept at normal schools as is authorized by
18 section four of chapter five hundred and ninety-seven of
19 the acts of nineteen hundred and eight. The principals
20 of the several normal schools shall be bonded in amounts
21 to be approved by the state board of education, — so as
22 to read as follows:— *Section 10.* The board shall have
23 the general management of the state normal schools and
24 the boarding houses connected therewith, and money ap-
25 propriated for their maintenance may be expended under
26 its direction. The receipts from pupils boarded in halls
27 maintained at normal schools shall be paid into the treas-
28 ury of the commonwealth monthly, and so much thereof
29 as is necessary to pay the expenses of wages, food and
30 supplies for dormitories and kitchens shall be paid there-
31 from upon approved schedules accompanied by vouchers
32 in the same manner that other claims against the com-
33 monwealth are paid; and all receipts from other sources
34 shall be paid into the treasury of the commonwealth
35 monthly as a part of the general revenue of the common-
36 wealth. The auditor of the commonwealth shall exercise
37 the same direction of all accounts kept at normal schools as
38 is authorized by section four of chapter five hundred and
39 ninety-seven of the acts of nineteen hundred and eight.
40 The principals of the several normal schools shall be
41 bonded in amounts to be approved by the state board of
42 education.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
