### RESOLVE

To provide for a Report by the Boston Transit Commission of a Route for an Extension of the Dorchester Tunnel in the City of Boston.

1 *Resolved*, That the Boston transit commission is  
2 hereby authorized and directed, after an appropriation  
3 sufficient to cover the expense of the same as estimated  
4 by it has been made by the city of Boston, to give public  
5 hearings, and to investigate and report to the next gen-  
6 eral court, on or before the first Saturday in January,  
7 a route for an extension of the Dorchester tunnel pro-  
8 vided for in chapter seven hundred and forty-one of the  
9 acts of the year nineteen hundred and eleven, said tunnel  
10 to start at Andrew Square and form a continuation of  
11 said Dorchester tunnel and to run to such point in the  
12 Dorchester district, not nearer the terminus provided  
13 in said act for said Dorchester tunnel than Codman  
14 square in said Dorchester district, as will most con-  
15 veniently afford access or approach for cars from Ne-  
16 ponset, Fields Corner, Milton Lower Mills and Matta-  
17 pan, so called, in said district. The commission shall  
18 embody in its report an estimate of the cost of con-  
19 structing such tunnel.
