AN ACT

Making Appropriations for the Salaries and Expenses
of the Board of Railroad Commissioners.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same,
as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The sums hereinafter mentioned are
2 appropriated, to be paid out of the Railroad Com-
3 missioners' Fund, for the salaries and expenses
4 of the railroad commissioners, for the fiscal year
5 ending on the thirtieth day of November, nineteen
6 hundred and twelve, to wit:—

7 For the salaries of the commissioners, sixteen
8 thousand dollars. (Rev. Laws, ch. 111; Acts 1906,
9 chs. 417 and 463.)

(Appropriation 1911, \$16,000.)

10 For the salary of the clerk, three thousand dol-
11 lars. (Rev. Laws, ch. 111; Acts 1906, chs. 417 and
12 463.)

(Appropriation 1911, \$3,000.)

13 For the salary of the assistant clerk, eighteen
14 hundred dollars. (Rev. Laws, ch. 111; Acts 1906,
15 chs. 417 and 463.)

(Appropriation 1911, \$1,800.)

16 For additional clerical assistance, a sum not ex-
17 ceeding thirty-four hundred dollars. (Rev. Laws,
18 ch. 111; Acts 1906, ch. 463.)

(Appropriation 1911, \$2,200.)

19 For the salary of the accountant, five thousand
20 dollars. (Rev. Laws, ch. 111; Acts 1906, ch. 463;
21 1911, ch. 755.)

(Appropriation 1911, \$3,400, part of a year.)

22 For the salaries and expenses of the railroad in-
23 spectors, a sum not exceeding twenty-four thou-
24 sand dollars. (Rev. Laws, ch. 111; Acts 1906, ch.
25 463; 1911, ch. 681.)

(Appropriation 1911, \$19,500.)

26 For the compensation of experts or other agents,
27 a sum not exceeding eighteen thousand dollars.
28 (Rev. Laws, ch. 111; Acts 1906, ch. 463; 1911, ch.
29 755.)

(Appropriation 1911, \$18,000.)

30 For rent, care of office and salary of a messenger,
31 a sum not exceeding sixty-two hundred dollars.
32 (Rev. Laws, ch. 111; Acts 1906, ch. 463.)

(Appropriation 1911, \$6,000.)

33 For books, maps, statistics, stationery, inci-
34 dentals and contingent expenses, a sum not exceed-
35 ing fifty-five hundred dollars. (Rev. Laws, ch. 111;
36 Acts 1906, ch. 463; 1910, ch. 401.)

(Appropriation 1911, \$5,500.)

37 For stenographers and stenographic reports, a
38 sum not exceeding twenty-four hundred dollars.
39 (Rev. Laws, ch. 111; Acts 1906, ch. 463.)

(Appropriation 1911, \$2,400.)

40 For printing and binding the annual report, a
41 sum not exceeding seventy-two hundred dollars.

42 (Rev. Laws, ch. 91, sect. 7; Acts 1905, ch. 438;
43 1906, ch. 463.)

(Appropriation 1911, \$7,000.)

44 For taking evidence given at inquests in case of
45 death by accident occurring upon railroads and
46 street railways, a sum not exceeding three thou-
47 sand dollars. (Rev. Laws, ch. 24, sect 14.)

(Appropriation 1911, \$3,000.)

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
