RESOLVE

In Favor of James Hurtin of Wakefield.

1 *Resolved*, That there be allowed and paid out of the treas-
2 ury of the commonwealth to James Hurtin of Wakefield
3 the sum of two thousand dollars for the loss of his son,
4 Arthur J. Hurtin, who was killed in the performance of his
5 duty at the rifle range in Wakefield and Reading in the
6 year nineteen hundred and ten.
