AN ACT

Relative to the Stenographer and Clerk employed by the Trustees of the Hospitals for Consumptives.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. The trustees of the hospitals for consump-
 - 2 tives may fix the salary of their stenographer and clerk at
 - 3 a sum not exceeding twelve hundred dollars per annum.
