BOARD OF HARBOR AND LAND COMMISSIONERS,
STATE HOUSE, BOSTON, May 15, 1912.

To the Honorable Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

By section 7 of chapter 25 of the Revised Laws, the Board of Harbor and Land Commissioners, with the concurrence of towns at meetings called for the purpose, may propose to the Legislature changes in the boundary lines between contiguous towns.

A portion of the existing boundary line between the towns of New Ashford and Cheshire is irregular and inadequately marked. In order to straighten this line and properly define and determine the angles or corners in it, the Board presented the proposed change to the towns aforesaid, which, at meetings duly warned, voted to concur with the Board in submitting the same to the Legislature. Copies of the certificates of the record of the action of the towns which were forwarded to the Board are herewith submitted, together with a draft of the act necessary to carry the recommendation into effect. A plan showing the proposed change in the boundary line is on file in the office of the Board.

AN ACT

To establish the Boundary Line between the Towns of New Ashford and Cheshire.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The following described line shall hereafter
2 be the boundary line between the towns of New Ashford and
3 Cheshire: Beginning at a stone monument standing at the
4 southwest corner of the town of Adams in latitude forty-
5 two degrees, thirty-five minutes, fifty-four and seventy-
6 seven one-hundredths seconds and longitude seventy-three
7 degrees, ten minutes, twenty-nine and one one-hundredth
8 seconds; thence north seventy degrees, fifty-three minutes
9 west (true bearing) eight thousand five hundred seventy-six
10 feet to a stone monument standing in latitude forty-two
11 degrees, thirty-six minutes, twenty-two and forty-nine one-
12 hundredths seconds and longitude seventy-three degrees,
13 twelve minutes, seventeen and thirty-six one-hundredths
14 seconds, at an angle in the present boundary line; thence
15 south twelve degrees, seven minutes east (true bearing) six
16 thousand thirty feet to a point on Rounds rock in latitude
17 forty-two degrees, thirty-five minutes, twenty-four and
18 twenty-six one-hundredths seconds and longitude seventy-

19 three degrees, twelve minutes and forty-five one-hundredths
20 seconds; thence south eight degrees, twenty-four minutes
21 west (true bearing) three thousand nine hundred ninety-four
22 feet to a marble monument standing at the present corner of
23 the towns of Cheshire, Lanesborough, and New Ashford, in
24 latitude forty-two degrees, thirty-four minutes, forty-five
25 and twenty-two one-hundredths seconds and longitude
26 seventy-three degrees, twelve minutes, eight and twenty-
27 five one-hundredths seconds.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
