AN ACT

To provide further for the Preservation of Life in the Construction, Alteration, Removal or Tearing Down of Buildings or Structures in the City of Boston.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The city of Boston may prescribe by
2 ordinance the qualifications which shall be required of
3 those having charge or control of the construction, alter-
4 ation, removal or tearing down of buildings or struct-
5 ures in said city, the means of determining such
6 qualifications and the terms and conditions upon which
7 permits for the construction, alteration, removal or tear-
8 ing down of buildings or structures may be issued by
9 the building commissioner. Any person who has been
10 refused a permit by the building commissioner, acting
11 under authority of any such ordinance, shall have a right
12 to appeal in accordance with the provisions of section
13 six of chapter five hundred and fifty of the acts of the
14 year nineteen hundred and seven.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
