BOSTON, Jan. 11, 1913.

To the Honorable Senate and House of Representatives:

Chapter 109 of the resolves of 1912 provides that the Boston Transit Commission

shall investigate and report to the general court on or before the second Saturday in January, nineteen hundred and thirteen, whether or not in the opinion of said Commission it is advisable and for the public interest to provide for the construction and operation of a tunnel connecting the cities of Boston and Chelsea; but the investigation shall not be begun nor the report made unless and until an appropriation sufficient to cover the expense thereof, as estimated by the said Commission, shall have been made by the city of Chelsea.

August 1st, 1912, the mayor of Chelsea was notified that in the opinion of the Commission, \$3,500 would be sufficient to cover the expense of such investigation and report.

No notice having been received from the municipality of such appropriation having been made, no further action has been taken by the Commission under this chapter.
