

HOUSE No. 1191

Bill accompanying the petition of Charles A. Stevens for legislation relative to salaries in the department of the Adjutant General of the militia. Public Service. January 14.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Thirteen.

AN ACT

To adjust the Salaries in the Department of the Adjutant General of the Militia.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section fourteen of chapter six hundred
2 and four of the acts of the year nineteen hundred and
3 eight, as amended by section one of chapter three hun-
4 dred and forty-eight of the acts of the year nineteen
5 hundred and ten, and as further amended by section one
6 of chapter five hundred and ninety-three of the acts of
7 the year nineteen hundred and twelve, is hereby amended
8 by striking out all after the word "employ", in the fifth
9 line, and inserting in place thereof the words: — a chief
10 clerk at a salary of twenty-two hundred dollars a year
11 and a second clerk at a salary of two thousand dollars a

12 year. He may also employ such additional clerks and
13 other assistants as may be necessary in his department,
14 at an expense not exceeding twelve thousand one hun-
15 dred dollars a year, — so that the section will read:—
16 *Section 14.* The adjutant general shall receive a salary
17 of thirty-six hundred dollars a year. An adjutant gen-
18 eral (rank of lieutenant colonel), adjutant general's de-
19 partment, shall receive a salary of eighteen hundred
20 dollars a year. The adjutant general may employ a
21 chief clerk at a salary of twenty-two hundred dollars a
22 year, and a second clerk at a salary of two thousand
23 dollars a year. He may also employ such additional
24 clerks and other assistants as may be necessary in his
25 department, at an expense not exceeding twelve thou-
26 sand one hundred dollars a year.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
