## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Thirteen.

### RESOLVE

To provide for an Amendment of the Constitution making  
Women eligible as Notaries Public.

1 *Resolved*, That the following article of amendment,  
2 having been agreed to by a majority of the senators and  
3 two thirds of the members of the house of representatives  
4 present and voting thereon, and having been entered on  
5 the journals of both houses, with the yeas and nays taken  
6 thereon, in the year last past, and referred to the present  
7 general court and published according to law and being  
8 agreed to by a majority of the senators and two thirds of  
9 the members of the house of representatives present and  
10 voting thereon, shall be submitted to the people for their  
11 ratification and adoption:—

#### ARTICLE OF AMENDMENT.

12 Article IV of the articles of amendment of the con-  
13 stitution of the commonwealth is hereby amended by  
14 adding thereto the following words:— “Women shall  
15 be eligible to appointment as notaries public”.
