AN ACT

Making Appropriations for Sundry Miscellaneous Expenses Authorized by Law.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The sums hereinafter mentioned are
2 appropriated, to be paid out of the treasury of the
3 commonwealth, from the ordinary revenue, for the
4 purposes specified, for the fiscal year ending on the
5 thirtieth day of November, nineteen hundred and
6 thirteen, to wit:—

7 For expenses incurred in the construction and re-
8 pair of roads in the town of Mashpee during the
9 year nineteen hundred and thirteen, the sum of
10 three hundred dollars. (Acts 1870, ch. 293.)

(Appropriation 1912, \$300.)

11 For reimbursing certain officials for premiums
12 paid for procuring securities on their bonds, a sum
13 not exceeding two thousand dollars. (Acts 1908,
14 ch. 469.)

(Appropriation 1912, \$2,000.)

15 For preliminary plans, specifications, etc., pro-
16 vided for by the act relative to the construction and
17 improvement of buildings, a sum not exceeding two
18 thousand dollars. (Acts 1907, ch. 520.)

(Appropriation 1912, \$2,000.)

19 For medical examiners' fees, a sum not exceeding
20 eight hundred dollars. (Rev. Laws, ch. 24, sec. 29;
21 Acts 1905, ch. 211.)

(Appropriation 1912, \$700.)

22 For the payment of damages caused by wild deer
23 for the present and previous years, a sum not ex-
24 ceeding sixteen thousand dollars. (Acts 1903, ch.
25 407.)

(Appropriation 1912, \$10,000.)

26 For small items of expenditure for which no ap-
27 propriations have been made or for which appro-
28 priations have exhausted or reverted to the com-
29 monwealth in previous years, a sum not exceeding
30 one thousand dollars, to be expended under the di-
31 rection of the auditor of the commonwealth.

(Appropriation 1912, \$1,000.)

32 For defraying the expenses of the headquarters
33 of the department of Massachusetts grand army of
34 the republic, the sum of one thousand dollars. (Re-
35 solves 1912, ch. 36.)

(Appropriation 1912, \$1,000.)

36 For the salary of the second deputy in the office
37 of the secretary of the commonwealth, commencing
38 February first, a sum not exceeding two thousand
39 eighty-three dollars and thirty-three cents, and so
40 much of the amounts appropriated by chapter
41 thirty-three of the acts of the present year for the
42 salary of Herbert H. Boynton, deputy, and for the

43 present corporation clerk as remained unexpended
44 on February first shall revert to the treasury of the
45 commonwealth.

46 For the compensation of certain members of the
47 commission on holdings of voluntary associations,
48 as authorized by chapter one hundred thirteen of
49 the resolves of the year nineteen hundred and
50 twelve, a sum not exceeding fifteen hundred dol-
51 lars, the same to be in addition to any amount here-
52 tofore appropriated for this purpose.

53 For the traveling expenses of district attorneys
54 and assistant district attorneys, for the present and
55 previous years, a sum not exceeding five hundred
56 dollars, the same to be in addition to any amount
57 heretofore appropriated for this purpose. (Acts
58 1905, ch. 157.)

59 For printing the report of the Connecticut val-
60 ley waterway board, as authorized by chapter two
61 of the resolves of the present year, a sum not ex-
62 ceeding five hundred dollars.

63 For the town of Westford, as authorized by chap-
64 ter three of the resolves of the present year, a sum
65 not exceeding two hundred and sixteen dollars.

66 For expenses of the commission appointed to in-
67 vestigate the subject of water supply for certain
68 cities and towns, as authorized by chapter four of
69 the resolves of the present year, a sum not ex-
70 ceeding twenty-five hundred dollars.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
