AN ACT

Relative to the Salaries of the Chaplains of the Senate
and House of Representatives.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the
same, as follows:*

1 Section fourteen of chapter three of the Re-
2 vised Laws is hereby amended by striking out
3 the word "three", in line two, and inserting in
4 place thereof the word:—six,—so as to read as
5 follows:—*Section 14.* The chaplain of the senate
6 and the chaplain of the house of representatives
7 shall each receive an annual salary of six hundred
8 dollars.
