The committee on Ways and Means, to whom was referred the Resolve to provide for certain additions and improvements at the Grafton colony of the Worcester State Asylum (printed in House, No. 221); the Resolve to provide for certain improvements at the State Infirmary (printed in House, No. 226); the Bill to authorize the Board of Trustees of Hospitals for Consumptives to make additional accommodations for patients at the Lakeville State Sanatorium (House, No. 230); the Bill to provide for the purchasing of land, buildings and equipment for a dairy farm for the Lakeville State Sanatorium (House, No. 231); the Bill to authorize the Board of Trustees of Hospitals for Consumptives to construct and equip a suitable laboratory at the Lakeville State Sanatorium (House, No. 232); the Bill to authorize the Board of Trustees of Hospitals for Consumptives to make additional accommodations for patients at the North Reading State Sanatorium (House, No. 233); the Bill to authorize the Board of Trustees of Hospitals for Consumptives to construct a sidewalk, make repairs upon the road, and drain the grounds at the North Reading State Sanatorium (House, No. 234); the Bill to authorize the Board of Trustees of Hospitals for Consumptives to construct a building and otherwise make additional accommodations for children at the Westfield State Sanatorium (House, No. 235); the Bill to authorize the Board of Trustees of Hospitals for Consumptives to construct a power house and laundry building, with equipment, at the

Westfield State Sanatorium (House, No. 236); the Resolve to provide for buildings and improvements at the Norfolk State Hospital (House, No. 238); the Bill to provide for certain improvements at the Lyman School for Boys (House, No. 240); the Resolve to provide for certain improvements at the Westborough State Hospital (House, No. 429); the Resolve to provide for certain improvements at the Wrentham State School (printed in House, No. 430); the Resolve (introduced on leave) to provide for certain improvements at the State Farm (printed as Senate, No. 470); the Resolve to provide for the purchase of land by the trustees of the Northampton State Hospital (printed as Senate, No. 472); the Resolve to provide for certain improvements at the Gardner State Colony; the Resolve to provide for certain improvements at the Monson State Hospital; the Resolve to provide for certain improvements at the State Industrial School for Girls; the Resolve to provide for certain improvements at the Industrial School for Boys; the Resolve to provide for certain improvements at the Northampton State Hospital; the Resolve to provide for certain improvements at the Boston State Hospital, and the Resolve to provide for certain improvements at the Worcester State Hospital, report the accompanying resolve.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Thirteen.

RESOLVE

To provide for Repairs and Improvements at Certain State Institutions.

1 *Resolved*, That there be allowed and paid out of the
2 treasury of the commonwealth, from the ordinary rev-
3 enue, for repairs and improvements at certain state
4 institutions, the sums hereinafter mentioned, to wit:—

INSANE AND FEEBLE-MINDED INSTITUTIONS.

5 For Boston state hospital, to be expended under the
6 direction of the trustees thereof, a sum not exceeding
7 two hundred ninety-three thousand dollars for the fol-
8 lowing purposes:—For constructing, equipping and
9 furnishing a reception building to accommodate forty-
10 eight male patients, a sum not exceeding fifty-two thou-
11 sand dollars; for constructing, equipping and furnishing
12 two cottages in Massachusetts industrial group to ac-
13 commodate twenty-six each, a sum not exceeding thirty-
14 two thousand dollars; for constructing, equipping and
15 furnishing two cottages for farm patients, a sum not
16 exceeding thirty-one thousand dollars; for constructing,
17 equipping and furnishing a dining room to serve the
18 industrial and farm group, a sum not exceeding eighteen
19 thousand dollars; for extending the present boiler
20 house at east group and installing conduit and piping

21 to make this serve entire institution, a sum not exceed-
22 ing one hundred and fifty thousand dollars; and for
23 extension of the water and sewerage system to proposed
24 new buildings, a sum not exceeding ten thousand dol-
25 lars.

26 For the Gardner state colony, to be expended under
27 the direction of the trustees thereof, a sum not exceeding
28 twelve thousand dollars for constructing and furnishing
29 one cottage for thirty patients.

30 For the Monson state hospital, to be expended under
31 the directions of the trustees thereof, a sum not ex-
32 ceeding one hundred thirty thousand dollars for con-
33 structing and furnishing a building for one hundred and
34 thirty insane patients.

35 For the Norfolk state hospital, to be expended by the
36 trustees of the Foxborough state hospital, administrators
37 of the Norfolk state hospital, a sum not exceeding
38 eighty-nine thousand dollars for the following purposes:
39 — For building, equipping and furnishing one cottage
40 for hospital patients, a sum not exceeding eight thou-
41 sand dollars; for building, equipping and furnishing
42 certain farm buildings, a sum not exceeding eighteen
43 thousand dollars; for building, equipping and furnish-
44 ing hospital building, a sum not exceeding twenty
45 thousand dollars; for building, equipping and furnish-
46 ing an industrial building, a sum not exceeding eight
47 thousand dollars; for building, equipping and furnish-
48 ing a service building, a sum not exceeding twenty-nine
49 thousand dollars; for a spur track, a sum not exceeding
50 two thousand dollars; and for a storage water tank and
51 water and sewerage connections, a sum not exceeding
52 four thousand dollars.

53 For the Northampton state hospital, to be expended
54 under the directions of the trustees thereof, for the pur-

55 chase and installation of new boilers, a sum not exceed-
56 ing ten thousand dollars.

57 For the Westborough state hospital, to be expended
58 under the direction of the trustees thereof, a sum not
59 exceeding eighty-seven thousand two hundred and fifty
60 dollars, for the following purposes:— For the reloca-
61 tion and reconstruction of a power and heating plant,
62 a sum not exceeding seventy thousand dollars; for reno-
63 vating and improving the sanitary condition of certain
64 wards, a sum not exceeding thirteen thousand dollars;
65 for the purchase of the Collins farm, so called, adjoining
66 the land of the state trustees and situated in the town
67 of Northborough, a sum not exceeding forty-two hun-
68 dred and fifty dollars.

69 For the Worcester state asylum, to be expended under
70 the direction of the trustees thereof at the Grafton
71 colony, a sum not exceeding two hundred eight thou-
72 sand and five hundred dollars for the following pur-
73 poses:— For one new kitchen and dining room with
74 dormitory, a sum not exceeding twenty-three thousand
75 dollars; for the repair of the old house of colony num-
76 ber two, a sum not exceeding thirty-three hundred dol-
77 lars; for one new boiler of one hundred and fifty
78 horsepower, a sum not exceeding two thousand dollars;
79 for filter bed enlargement, a sum not exceeding twenty-
80 five thousand dollars; for water supply and development
81 of reservoir, a sum not exceeding sixteen thousand dol-
82 lars; for one motor generator, a sum not exceeding
83 fifty-nine hundred dollars; for a male nurses' home, a
84 sum not exceeding forty-nine thousand dollars; for a
85 female nurses' home, a sum not exceeding thirty-six
86 thousand three hundred dollars; for a service build-
87 ing, central kitchen and dormitory at colony number
88 four, a sum not exceeding forty-eight thousand dollars.

89 For the Worcester state hospital, to be expended
90 under the direction of the trustees thereof, a sum not
91 exceeding twenty-one thousand five hundred and
92 seventy-five dollars for the following purposes:— For
93 constructing and furnishing one cottage for employees,
94 a sum not exceeding eighty-nine hundred and seventy-
95 five dollars; for finishing and furnishing the attic of
96 the present female nurses' home, to provide for twenty
97 nurses, a sum not exceeding eight thousand dollars;
98 and for completing alterations in and furnishing farm-
99 house, a sum not exceeding forty-six hundred dollars.

100 For the Wrentham state school, to be expended under
101 the direction of the trustees thereof, a sum not exceed-
102 ing two hundred ninety-two thousand five hundred
103 dollars for the following purposes:— For constructing
104 and furnishing a custodial building, a sum not exceed-
105 ing seventy-two thousand dollars; for constructing and
106 furnishing two dormitories, a sum not exceeding one
107 hundred thousand dollars; for constructing and fur-
108 nishing three homes for employees, a sum not exceeding
109 forty-three thousand five hundred dollars; for construct-
110 ing and furnishing an administration building, a sum
111 not exceeding twenty-two thousand dollars; for addi-
112 tions to the power house, including two additional
113 boilers, hot-water heater and distributing mains, a sum
114 not exceeding twenty-eight thousand dollars; for addi-
115 tions to service building, a sum not exceeding twenty-
116 five thousand dollars; and for laundry equipment, a sum
117 not exceeding two thousand dollars.

TUBERCULOSIS SANATORIA.

118 For the Lakeville state sanatorium, to be expended
119 under the direction of the trustees of the hospitals for
120 consumptives, a sum not exceeding twenty thousand

121 dollars for the following purposes: — For the erection
122 and equipment of a pavilion for thirty patients and
123 nine employees, a sum not exceeding thirteen thousand
124 dollars; for additions to the present wards for men and
125 women, a sum not exceeding six thousand dollars; for
126 constructing and equipping a suitable laboratory, a sum
127 not exceeding one thousand dollars.

128 For the North Reading state sanatorium, to be ex-
129 pended under the direction of the trustees of the hos-
130 pitals for consumptives, a sum not exceeding fourteen
131 thousand four hundred twenty-seven dollars and ninety-
132 three cents for the following purposes: — For the con-
133 struction of a pavilion for twenty-four patients, a sum
134 not exceeding sixty-two hundred twenty-four dollars
135 and sixty-two cents; for suitable alterations and addi-
136 tions to the dining room, a sum not exceeding sixty-
137 seven hundred three dollars and thirty-one cents; and
138 for constructing a silo and making repairs upon road
139 and draining the grounds at said institution, a sum not
140 exceeding fifteen hundred dollars.

141 For the Westfield state sanatorium, to be expended
142 under the direction of the trustees of the hospitals for
143 consumptives, a sum not exceeding thirty-seven thou-
144 sand dollars for the following purposes: — For the
145 construction, furnishing and equipment of a children's
146 ward, a sum not exceeding twenty thousand dollars;
147 and for a power house, laundry building fully equipped,
148 a sum not exceeding seventeen thousand dollars.

TRAINING SCHOOLS.

149 For the industrial school for boys, to be expended
150 under the direction of the trustees of the Massachusetts
151 training schools, a sum not exceeding twenty-seven
152 thousand five hundred and fifty dollars for the follow-

153 ing purposes:— For constructing and furnishing two
154 cottages for thirty boys each and attendants, a sum not
155 exceeding eighteen thousand two hundred dollars; for
156 heating and furnishing two cottages, a sum not exceed-
157 ing three thousand dollars; for explorations and investi-
158 gations for a water system, a sum not exceeding seven
159 hundred dollars; for general improvements, including
160 moving and remodeling a small house into a cottage
161 tenement, storing ensilage, chicken house, platform
162 scales, extension of sidewalks, sewer beds and water
163 pipe connections, a sum not exceeding fifty-six hundred
164 and fifty dollars.

165 For the state industrial school for girls, to be ex-
166 pended under the direction of the trustees of the Massa-
167 chusetts training schools, a sum not exceeding forty-
168 four thousand one hundred and fifty dollars for the
169 following purposes:— For the construction of a central
170 school building, furnishing and equipping the same, a
171 sum not exceeding forty thousand dollars; for renewing
172 and extending the telephone system, a sum not exceed-
173 ing sixteen hundred dollars; for a heating system for
174 the Fisher cottage, a sum not exceeding nineteen hun-
175 dred and fifty dollars; and for the extension of side-
176 walks, a sum not exceeding six hundred dollars.

177 For the Lyman school for boys, to be expended under
178 the direction of the trustees of the Massachusetts train-
179 ing schools, a sum not exceeding twenty-nine hundred
180 dollars for the following purposes:— For exploration
181 and investigation for a water supply, a sum not exceed-
182 ing seven hundred dollars; for shoe machinery and
183 equipment, a sum not exceeding twelve hundred dollars;
184 and for an ice house, a sum not exceeding one thousand
185 dollars.

MISCELLANEOUS.

186 For the state infirmary, to be expended under the
187 direction of the trustees and superintendent, a sum not
188 exceeding fifty thousand dollars for the following pur-
189 poses: — For additions and alterations to the adminis-
190 tration building, a sum not exceeding twenty-eight
191 thousand dollars; and for constructing and equipping
192 a laboratory building, a sum not exceeding twenty-two
193 thousand dollars.

194 For the state farm, to be expended under the direc-
195 tion of the trustees and superintendent, a sum not ex-
196 ceeding fourteen thousand eight hundred dollars for
197 the following purposes: — For an additional water sup-
198 ply, a sum not exceeding ten thousand dollars; for the
199 purchase of land, a sum not exceeding four thousand
200 dollars; and for recording machinery and instruments
201 for the power plant, a sum not exceeding eight hundred
202 dollars.
