AN ACT

Making Appropriations for Salaries and Expenses in the Department of the Adjutant General and for Sundry Military Expenses.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The sums hereinafter mentioned are
2 appropriated, to be paid out of the treasury of the
3 commonwealth, from the ordinary revenue, for sal-
4 aries and expenses in the department of the adju-
5 tant general, and for sundry military expenses, for
6 the fiscal year ending on the thirtieth day of No-
7 vember, nineteen hundred and thirteen, to wit:—

8 For the salary of the adjutant general, thirty-six
9 hundred dollars. (Acts 1908, ch. 604.)

(Appropriation 1912, \$3,600.)

10 For the salary of the assistant adjutant general,
11 eighteen hundred dollars. (Acts 1911, ch. 348.)

(Appropriation 1912, \$1,800.)

12 For the salaries of four clerks in his department,
13 seven thousand dollars. (Acts 1908, ch. 604.)

(Appropriation 1912, \$7,000.)

14 For the salary of a messenger in his department,
15 eight hundred dollars. (Acts 1908, ch. 604.)

(Appropriation 1912, \$800.)

16 For additional clerical assistance, a sum not ex-
17 ceeding eighty-five hundred dollars. (Acts 1908, ch.
18 604; 1912, ch. 593.)

(Appropriation 1912, \$7,640.)

19 For incidental and contingent office expenses, in-
20 cluding printing and binding the annual report, a
21 sum not exceeding seven thousand dollars. (Acts
22 1908, ch. 604.)

(Appropriation 1912, \$6,000.)

23 For expenses in connection with military accounts
24 not otherwise provided for, a sum not exceeding
25 seven thousand dollars. (Acts 1908, ch. 604.)

(Appropriation 1912, \$7,000.)

26 For compensation of officers and men of the vol-
27 unteer militia, a sum not exceeding two hundred
28 thousand dollars, and not exceeding fifteen thou-
29 sand dollars of this sum may be expended in con-
30 nection with military maneuvers. (Acts 1908, ch.
31 604; 1911, ch. 594.)

(Appropriation 1912, \$225,000.)

32 For the transportation of officers and men of the
33 volunteer militia, when on military duty, a sum not
34 exceeding thirty-eight thousand dollars. (Acts
35 1908, ch. 604.)

(Appropriation 1912, \$38,000.)

36 For expenses in connection with the rifle practice
37 of the militia, a sum not exceeding twenty-five thou-
38 sand five hundred dollars. (Acts 1908, ch. 604;
39 1909, ch. 300.)

(Appropriation 1912, \$25,500.)

40 For an allowance to commissioned officers of the

41 volunteer militia towards the purchase of uniforms,
42 a sum not exceeding eighteen thousand dollars.
43 (Acts 1908, ch. 604.)

(Appropriation 1912, \$18,000.)

44 For allowance to officers of the volunteer militia
45 for the care and responsibility of property, a sum
46 not exceeding sixty-four hundred and fifty dollars.
47 (Acts 1908, ch. 604.)

(Appropriation 1912, \$6,350.)

48 For allowance and repair of clothing of the vol-
49 unteer militia, a sum not exceeding thirteen thou-
50 sand six hundred and seventy-two dollars. (Acts
51 1908, ch. 604.)

(Appropriation 1912, \$13,444.)

52 For allowance to headquarters and companies, a
53 sum not exceeding thirty-eight hundred and thirty
54 dollars. (Acts 1908, ch. 604.)

(Appropriation 1912, \$3,830.)

55 For services of company armorers, a sum not ex-
56 ceeding twelve thousand five hundred dollars. (Acts
57 1908, ch. 604.)

(Appropriation 1912, \$12,500.)

58 For furnishing, repair and care of any United
59 States ship loaned to the commonwealth of Massa-
60 chusetts for the use of the naval militia, a sum not
61 exceeding fifteen thousand dollars. (Acts 1908, ch.
62 604.)

(Appropriation 1912, \$15,000.)

63 For giving instruction in riding to non-commis-
64 sioned officers and others who are required by law
65 to be mounted, a sum not exceeding sixty-five hun-
66 dred dollars. (Acts 1908, ch. 604.)

(Appropriation 1912, \$6,000.)

67 For instruction in military authority, organiza-

68 tion and administration and in the elements of mili-
69 tary art, a sum not exceeding four thousand dollars.
70 (Acts 1908, chs. 317 and 604.)

(Appropriation 1912, \$4,000.)

71 For the payment of claims for death or injuries
72 to horses used by the militia, a sum not exceeding
73 twenty-five hundred dollars. (Acts 1910, ch. 227.)

(Appropriation 1912, \$2,500.)

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
