

Bill accompanying the petition of Roland D. Sawyer and others that the annual state election be held on Monday instead of Tuesday. Election Laws. January 12.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Fourteen.

AN ACT

To change the Day of the Annual State Election.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section two hundred and seventy-seven of Part III of
2 chapter eight hundred and thirty-five of the acts of the
3 year nineteen hundred and thirteen is hereby amended by
4 striking out the words " Tuesday next after the first Mon-
5 day in November ", in lines five and six, and inserting in
6 place thereof the words: — first Monday in November, —
7 so as to read as follows: — *Section 277.* The annual state
8 election for the choice of governor, lieutenant governor,
9 councillors, secretary, treasurer and receiver general,
10 attorney-general, auditor of the commonwealth, and sen-
11 ators and representatives in the general court, shall be
12 held on the first Monday in November. There shall also
13 be chosen at the annual state election, when required by
14 law, presidential electors, and, in their respective districts
15 or counties, representatives in congress, district attorneys,
16 clerks of the courts, registers of probate and insolvency,
17 registers of deeds, county commissioners, associate com-
18 missioners, sheriffs and county treasurers.
