Bill accompanying the petition of Patrick E. Murray, Jr., relative to the sale of intoxicating liquors on election days. Election Laws. January 15.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Fourteen.

AN ACT

Relative to the Sale of Intoxicating Liquors in Cities on
Certain Election Days.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section six of Part I of chapter eight
2 hundred and thirty-five of the acts of the year nineteen
3 hundred and thirteen is hereby amended by striking out
4 at the end thereof the words "to wards in which no elec-
5 tion is held", so as to read as follows:— *Section 6.* No
6 common victualler having a license of the first, second or
7 third class for the sale of intoxicating liquors and no per-
8 son, other than a wholesale druggist, having a license
9 therefor of the fourth or fifth class shall sell, give away or
10 deliver on the licensed premises any such liquors on the
11 day on which a state, city or annual town election is held

12 in the city or town in which such premises are situated;
 13 and no innkeeper having a license for the sale of intoxi-
 14 cating liquors shall, on the day of any such election, sell,
 15 give away or deliver in his inn any such liquors to other
 16 than persons who have resorted to his inn for food or lodg-
 17 ing; but the provisions of this section shall not apply in
 18 case of an election held in a city on a day other than that
 19 of the annual city election therein.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
