

HOUSE No. 1827

Bill accompanying the petition of Charles L. Baker and another relative to the admission of patients to the state consumptive hospitals in proportion to the population of cities and towns. Public Health. January 26.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Fourteen.

AN ACT

Relative to admission to the State Sanatoria for Tubercular Patients.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The trustees of hospitals for consumptives
2 shall not admit to any of the state sanatoria or hospitals
3 for consumptive patients from any city or town which has
4 its full quota, unless after notice of one week to a city
5 or town which has not its full quota such city or town
6 fails to send patients to fill the same. The number of
7 patients which each city and town is entitled to send to
8 these state hospitals or sanatoria shall be in proportion
9 to the population.

1 SECTION 2. All acts or parts of acts inconsistent here-
2 with are hereby repealed.

1 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
