

Bill accompanying the petition of Elizabeth M. McDonough that the compensation be increased and travelling expenses be allowed to certain official stenographers. Public Service. January 26.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Fourteen.

AN ACT

To fix Compensation for Official Stenographers to whom no Salary is paid.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Each stenographer appointed under sec-
2 tions eighty to eighty-four of chapter one hundred and
3 sixty-five of the Revised Laws for service for which no
4 annual salary is fixed by law shall receive the sum of
5 fourteen dollars for each day's actual and necessary at-
6 tendance at court, to be paid by the county on the order
7 of the presiding judge; and may be reimbursed in like
8 manner at the direction of said judge for reasonable and
9 necessary expenses actually incurred for travel and board
10 when attending court elsewhere than in the city or town
11 in which he lives or has his usual place of business.

1 SECTION 2. So much of section eighty of chapter one
2 hundred and sixty-five of the Revised Laws, as is incon-
3 sistent herewith, is hereby repealed.

1 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
