RESOLVE

In Favor of the Widow of Frederick W. Sheppard.

1 *Resolved*, That there be allowed and paid out of the
2 treasury of the commonwealth an annuity of five hun-
3 dred dollars for the term of five years to Mary A. Shep-
4 pard, widow of Frederick W. Sheppard, who lost his life
5 while attempting to extinguish forest fires on May
6 eleventh, nineteen hundred and thirteen. The said an-
7 nuity shall date from December first, nineteen hundred
8 and thirteen, and be payable in equal quarterly install-
9 ments.
