AN ACT

Making Appropriations for the Salaries and Expenses
of the Public Service Commission.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the
same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The sums hereinafter mentioned are
2 appropriated, to be paid out of the treasury of the
3 commonwealth, from the ordinary revenue, for the
4 salaries and expenses of the public service commis-
5 sion for the fiscal year ending on the thirtieth day
6 of November, nineteen hundred and fourteen, to
7 wit:—

8 For the salaries of the commissioners, forty thou-
9 sand five hundred dollars. (Acts 1913, ch. 784.)

10 For salaries and expenses in the inspection de-
11 partment, a sum not exceeding thirty-nine thou-
12 sand five hundred dollars. (Acts 1913, ch. 784.)

13 For salaries and expenses in the accounting de-
14 partment, a sum not exceeding seven thousand dol-
15 lars. (Acts 1913, ch. 784.)

16 For salaries and expenses in the tariff depart-

17 ment, a sum not exceeding six thousand dollars.
18 (Acts 1913, ch. 784.)

19 For salaries of secretaries, a sum not exceeding
20 ten thousand five hundred dollars. (Acts 1913, ch.
21 784.)

22 For clerical assistance and messenger service, a
23 sum not exceeding twelve thousand three hundred
24 dollars. (Acts 1913, ch. 784.)

25 For rent and care of office, a sum not exceeding
26 fourteen thousand dollars. (Acts 1913, ch. 784.)

27 For expenses of the telephone department, a sum
28 not exceeding five thousand dollars. (Acts 1913,
29 ch. 784.)

30 For printing and binding, including printing the
31 annual report, a sum not exceeding twelve thousand
32 dollars. (Acts 1913, ch. 784.)

33 For stenographic reports of hearings, a sum not
34 exceeding six thousand dollars. (Acts 1913, ch.
35 784.)

36 For stationery, books, maps and office supplies, a
37 sum not exceeding five thousand dollars. (Acts
38 1913, ch. 784.)

39 For incidental and contingent expenses, a sum not
40 exceeding five thousand dollars. (Acts 1913, ch.
41 784.)

42 For salaries and expenses of experts, a sum not
43 exceeding ten thousand dollars. (Acts 1913, ch.
44 784.)

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
