## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Fourteen.

### RESOLVE

To authorize the Purchase of Statute Law and Legislative Records, the Preservation of Tax Acts and the Making of a Public Card Catalogue for the State Library.

1     *Resolved*, That there be allowed and paid out of the  
2 treasury of the commonwealth, to be expended by the  
3 trustees of the state library, a sum not exceeding five  
4 thousand dollars for the purchase of foreign and Ameri-  
5 can statute law and legislative records to perfect so far  
6 as practicable the collections of the state library; a sum  
7 not exceeding two thousand dollars for the repair and  
8 preservation of tax acts of the commonwealth prior to  
9 eighteen hundred and fifty and for the repair and preser-  
10 vation of other rare and valuable laws and public docu-  
11 ments; a sum not exceeding three thousand dollars for  
12 making a card catalogue for public use.
