## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Fourteen.

### AN ACT

To regulate the Sale of Food Fish.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 SECTION 1. All fresh food fish coming into the state  
2 shall be sold by weight at the time of delivery.
- 1 SECTION 2. Violation of the provisions of this act  
2 shall be punished by a fine of not less than twenty-five  
3 nor more than one hundred dollars for each offence.
- 1 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
