AN ACT

Relative to the Sale of Fruits, Vegetables and Nuts.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section twenty-one of chapter fifty-seven of the Revised
2 Laws, as amended by chapter two hundred and forty-six
3 of the acts of the year nineteen hundred and twelve and
4 by chapter seven hundred and thirteen of the acts of the
5 year nineteen hundred and thirteen, is hereby further
6 amended by striking out the said section and inserting
7 in place thereof the following: — *Section 21.* All fruits,
8 vegetables and nuts for which a legal weight has been
9 established shall be sold at retail only by dry measure,
10 weight or numerical count, but not less than the legal
11 weight shall be given when the same are sold by dry
12 measure. Peas and beans sold in quantities of four
13 quarts or less for seeding or planting purposes shall be
14 sold at retail only by weight or numerical count. Who-
15 ever violates any provision of this section shall forfeit
16 a sum not exceeding ten dollars for each offence.
