

HOUSE No. 2579

Bill accompanying the petition of C. O. Blood and others for the incorporation of the Lynn Chamber of Commerce. Mercantile Affairs. May 7.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Fourteen.

AN ACT

To incorporate the Lynn Chamber of Commerce.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Charles O. Blood, Walter C. Fish,
2 Alexander E. Little, Edward W. Burt, Eugene B.
3 Fraser, Frederic W. Perkins, Arthur W. Pinkham,
4 Frank P. Aborn, Fred H. Druehl, John B. Quinn, John
5 Henry Welch, William H. Niles, Clifton Colburn,
6 Franklin L. Goddard, Charles Neal Barney, Benjamin
7 N. Johnson, Henry B. Sprague, Edwin J. Dolan,
8 Charles S. Sanborn, Arthur Stern and Charles H.
9 Stephenson, their associates and successors, are hereby
10 constituted a body corporate by the name of the Lynn
11 chamber of commerce, for the purpose of promoting the
12 commerce, industry, business and public interests of

13 Lynn, for the promotion and regulation of a commercial
14 exchange in the city of Lynn, for the acquisition, preser-
15 vation and dissemination of business information, for the
16 adjustment of controversies and misunderstandings, for
17 the establishment and maintenance of uniformity in com-
18 mercial usages, and for the promotion of just and equit-
19 able principles of trade.

1 SECTION 2. The said corporation may adopt such
2 by-laws, consistent with this act and the laws of the
3 commonwealth, as may be necessary for its purposes, and
4 may take and hold in fee simple or any less estate, by
5 gift, grant, bequest or otherwise, real or personal prop-
6 erty to the amount of fifty thousand dollars.

1 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
