RESOLVE

To provide for Buildings and Improvements at the North Reading State Sanatorium.

1 *Resolved*, That a sum not exceeding sixty-eight hun-
2 dred and eighty-four dollars be paid out of the treasury
3 of the commonwealth, from the ordinary revenue, to be
4 expended under the direction of the trustees of hospitals
5 for consumptives at the North Reading state sanatorium
6 for the following purposes: — For constructing an addi-
7 tion to the administration building, refrigerator and gar-
8 bage room, a sum not exceeding three thousand dollars;
9 for erecting a small out building for the storage of farm
10 implements, a sum not exceeding eight hundred dollars;
11 for constructing a covered bin for anthracite coal, a sum
12 not exceeding five hundred dollars; and for erecting a
13 new twenty-five thousand gallon cypress tank with one
14 hundred foot steel tower, a sum not exceeding twenty-
15 five hundred and eighty-four dollars.
