AN ACT

To establish a Part of the Boundary Line between the Towns of Barnstable and Mashpee and to annex a Part of the Town of Sandwich to the Town of Barnstable.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The following described line shall
2 hereafter be a part of the boundary line between
3 the towns of Barnstable and Mashpee:—Be
4 ginning at the center of Santuit river at a present
5 corner of the towns of Barnstable, Mashpee and
6 Sandwich at a point opposite a stone witness
7 mark situated on the westerly bank of said river
8 about nine hundred feet southwest of the bridge
9 crossing the river in the main highway leading
10 from the village of Santuit to the village of
11 Waquoit; thence south seventy-one degrees,
12 fifty-five minutes west, true bearing, about fifty-
13 six feet to said witness mark, a rough granite
14 monument marked B. M. S. in the present
15 boundary line between Mashpee and Sandwich in

16 latitude forty-one degrees, thirty-eight minutes
17 and five and ninety-seven one hundredths sec-
18 onds, and longitude seventy degrees, twenty-
19 seven minutes, fourteen and forty-two one hun-
20 dredths seconds; thence in the same direct on
21 seven hundred and five feet to a rough granite
22 monument situated on the easterly side of a pas-
23 sageway; thence north twenty-eight degrees,
24 twenty minutes west, true bearing, two hundred
25 and seventy-four feet to a rough granite monu-
26 ment situated at the intersection of the southerly
27 line of the main road leading from Santuit village
28 to Waquoit village with the westerly line of said
29 passageway; thence westerly along the southerly
30 line of said Santuit-Waquoit road about eleven
31 hundred and ninety-eight feet to a rough granite
32 monument situated in the southerly line of said
33 road; thence north sixteen degrees, forty-two
34 minutes west, true bearing, crossing said road
35 thirty-two feet to a rough granite monument
36 situated on the northerly line of said road; thence
37 westerly along the northerly line of said Santuit-
38 Waquoit road about eleven hundred and ninety-
39 eight feet to a rough granite monument situated at
40 the intersection of the northerly line of said road
41 with the easterly line of a road leading north-
42 westerly; thence northwesterly along the easterly
43 line of said road about ten hundred and forty feet
44 to a rough granite monument situated in wood-
45 land on the northerly line of said road; thence
46 north nineteen degrees, eight minutes east, true
47 bearing, ten hundred and eighty feet to a rough

48 granite monument situated on the easterly slope of
49 a ridge; thence north eighty-six degrees, thirteen
50 minutes east, true bearing, two thousand one hun-
51 dred and forty-five feet to a rough granite monu-
52 ment situated on the northeasterly slope of a
53 ridge southwest from a cranberry bog; thence
54 north sixty degrees fifty-two minutes east, true
55 bearing, crossing Coombs pond, twelve hundred
56 and eighty-nine feet to a rough granite monu-
57 ment situated at the junction of a cart-path with
58 the westerly line of a road leading from Santuit vil-
59 lage to Mashpee village; thence south seventy-
60 one degrees, forty-seven minutes east, true bear-
61 ing, five hundred and eighteen feet to a witness
62 mark, a rough granite monument marked B. M. S.
63 situated on the westerly bank of the Santuit river
64 at a point two hundred and sixty feet northerly
65 from the bridge crossing said river at the highway
66 leading from Santuit village to Mashpee village,
67 in latitude forty-one degrees, thirty-eight minutes,
68 nineteen and seventy one hundredths seconds,
69 and longitude seventy-one degrees, twenty-seven
70 minutes, ten and ninety-nine one hundredths sec-
71 onds; thence in the same direction about fifteen
72 feet to a present corner of the towns of Barnstable,
73 Mashpee and Sandwich, a point in the middle of
74 the Santuit river; thence in a general southerly
75 direction, following the middle of said river, to
76 the point of beginning. Said line is shown in
77 detail on a plan marked "Commonwealth of
78 Massachusetts Harbor and Land Commissioners'
79 Office Portion of the town of Sandwich set off and

80 made a part of the town of Barnstable April,
81 1916.”

1 SECTION 2. The area bounded by the lines de-
2 scribed in section one of this act is hereby set off
3 from the town of Sandwich and annexed to the
4 town of Barnstable; the remainder of the area
5 which was annexed to the town of Sandwich by
6 chapter eighty-seven of the acts of the year
7 eighteen hundred and ten, and the part set off to
8 Mashpee by chapter three hundred and six of the
9 acts of the year nineteen hundred and five shall
10 hereafter continue to be a part of the town of
11 Mashpee.

1 SECTION 3. Said towns of Barnstable and
2 Mashpee shall forthwith file with the secretary of
3 the commonwealth a copy of said plan.

1 SECTION 4. The taxes assessable for the cur-
2 rent year, as well as for all subsequent years, on
3 persons and property within the area set off from
4 the town of Sandwich and annexed to the town
5 of Barnstable, under the provisions of this act,
6 shall be assessed and collected by the assessors of
7 the town of Barnstable, in the same manner and
8 to the same uses as taxes on other property within
9 the limits of said town of Barnstable as heretofore
10 bounded and defined.

1 SECTION 5. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
