AN ACT

To provide for Widening and Deepening the Channel
in the Mystic River.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the
same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Section one of chapter five hun-
2 dred and fifty-five of the acts of the year nineteen
3 hundred and fourteen is hereby amended by
4 striking out the words, "From a point opposite
5 Island End river to a point near Waterman's
6 Wharf, so called: *provided*, that the directors are
7 satisfied that the owners or lessees of the said
8 wharf will build a terminal of proper proportions
9 and capacity for use by ocean going steamers."

1 SECTION 2. There is hereby appropriated, to
2 be paid out of the principal of the Harbor Com-
3 pensation Fund, as established by section twenty-
4 three of chapter ninety-six of the Revised Laws, a
5 sum not exceeding two hundred thousand dollars,
6 to be expended under the direction of the directors

7 of the port of Boston for the widening, deepening
 8 and extending the channel in the Mystic river
 9 between the Chelsea and Malden bridges, so
 10 called.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its
 2 passage.
