### RESOLVE

Requiring the Special Recess Commission on Social Insurance to include in its Investigation and Report the Subject of the Hours of Labor in Industries operated continuously for Twenty-four Hours.

1 *Resolved*, That the special recess commission on social  
2 insurance established by chapter one hundred and fifty-  
3 seven of the resolves of the year nineteen hundred and  
4 sixteen, in addition to the matters already referred to  
5 said commission, shall study and investigate the subject  
6 of reasonable restrictions in the hours of labor in indus-  
7 tries operated continuously for twenty-four hours, and  
8 shall include in its report to the next general court such  
9 recommendations, with drafts of proposed legislation, as  
10 it may deem practical and expedient. All the provisions  
11 of said chapter shall, so far as pertinent, apply to the  
12 investigation herein authorized.
