

HOUSE No. 892

Bill accompanying the petition of Reginald L. Robbins for legislation to fix the salary of the Tax Commissioner. Public Service. January 15.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventeen.

AN ACT

To fix the Salary of the Tax Commissioner.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Acts of nineteen hundred and nine, chapter
2 four hundred and ninety, Part III, section one, are hereby
3 amended by striking out in the last line of section one,
4 the words "Five thousand dollars", and inserting in the
5 place thereof the words: — Seventy-five hundred dollars.

1 SECTION 2. Payments of said salary at the rate of
2 seventy-five hundred dollars a year shall be made as of
3 December first, nineteen hundred and sixteen.

1 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
