## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

### AN ACT

To establish Street Railway Service in Pleasant Street in the City of Boston.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The public service commission is hereby  
2 directed to promptly investigate, through public hearing,  
3 the necessity and convenience to the general public of  
4 street railway service in Pleasant street, Boston (widened  
5 under the acts of nineteen hundred and eleven, chapter  
6 five hundred and ninety-one, this act carrying an amend-  
7 ment by chapter one hundred and fifty-three of the acts  
8 of nineteen hundred and sixteen).

1 SECTION 2. And if said commission finds that the  
2 necessity and convenience of the public require said rail-  
3 way service, then said commission is hereby directed to  
4 take such action as is necessary to promptly establish said  
5 railway service.

Section 1. The House of Representatives shall be composed of members chosen by the people of the State, and shall have the sole power of originating bills for raising revenue, and shall have the sole power of appropriating money, and shall have the sole power of impeaching and trying judges of the State.
