### AN ACT

Making Appropriations for the Maintenance of the  
Reformatory for Women.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives  
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the  
same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. A sum not exceeding one hundred  
2 twenty-three thousand one hundred nine dollars  
3 is hereby appropriated, to be paid out of the  
4 treasury of the commonwealth, from the ordinary  
5 revenue, for the maintenance of the reformatory  
6 for women for the fiscal year ending on the  
7 thirtieth day of November, nineteen hundred and  
8 seventeen. (Revised Laws, ch. 223.)

(Appropriation 1916, \$101,205.76.)

9 For the town of Framingham, toward the  
10 annual expense of maintaining the system of  
11 sewage disposal at said reformatory, the sum of  
12 six hundred dollars. (Acts 1892, ch. 211.)

(Appropriation 1916, \$600.)

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its  
2 passage.

## AN ACT

relating to the regulation of the sale of liquor in the  
City of Cambridge, Massachusetts.

Enacted by the City Council of Cambridge, Massachusetts,  
at a special session, on the 14th day of March, 1911.

Section 1. A license shall be granted to any person who  
desires to sell liquor in the City of Cambridge, Massachusetts,  
for the purpose of selling the same for consumption on the  
premises where sold, to be sold and to be  
consumed on the premises where sold.

Section 2. The license shall be granted to the applicant  
if he is a resident of the City of Cambridge, Massachusetts,  
and if he is a person of good character and of good  
reputation, and if he is a person who is not  
under any legal disability.
