AN ACT

Relative to the Establishment of Stations for the Rearing
of Trout in Certain Counties.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the
same, as follows:*

1 The board of commissioners on fisheries and game is
2 hereby authorized to establish and maintain one or more
3 rearing stations, situated at such places as they may
4 select within the counties of Hampshire, Franklin and
5 Berkshire, for the purpose of rearing to fingerling size the
6 surplus trout fry which the present fish hatcheries
7 annually produce, and for this purpose may expend a
8 sum from the treasury of the commonwealth not ex-
9 ceeding five thousand dollars.
